- The 2,829 African American students enrolled represent 18.0% of the total enrollment
- Admission of First-Time Freshmen increased by 61 students, from 1,952 Fall 1999 to 2,013 Fall 2000
- Average ACT score for First-Time Freshmen is 23.14
- 2013 New First-Time Freshmen, of these 36 are National Merit Scholars and two students scored a perfect 36 on their ACT test
