Dear Sir

I have just returned from New Orleans and have
seen Mr. Nathan who expects you to send him forty bales
more, I assured him you would do all you could, and
he has given me a regular power of attorney & I am
fully authorized to give you any instructions you may want
you will see you cotton only sold for 7 1/2¢ I sold mine at
the same, it is still declining - if you have any in store
~~send it forth~~ let me know; if any to send down, do it forth
as it will decline further
with, - Do you know Mr. Coates' intentions?

Boston, 9th July, 1840

P.S. I enclose you his acct. I paid Robinson
before I could get the cotton.
