SUMMARY

- Main Campus enrollment stands at 16,066 an increase of 302 students from the Fall 2000 semester
- The 2,804 African American students enrolled represent 18% of the total enrollment
- Admission of First-Time Freshmen decreased by 236 students, from 2,013 Fall 2000 to 1,777 Fall 2001
- Average ACT score for First-Time Freshmen is 23.5
- 1,777 New First-Time Freshmen, including 33 National Merit and National Achievement scholars
