

Manual of Equine Lameness provides essential information on equine lameness diagnostics and treatment in an easy-to-use format ideal for the clinical setting. A clinically relevant distillation of

topics from Adams and Stashak's *Lameness in Horses*, this text offers a quick introduction and fast access to key information. An accompanying DVD includes practical supplements, including additional anatomical images, video clips demonstrating key procedures such as perineural and intrasynovial injections, and examples of lameness conditions in motion. Designed for use in daily practice, the book is presented in brief chapters carefully formatted to maximize the usefulness for practicing veterinarians. *Manual of Equine Lameness* is an invaluable resource to any veterinarian treating lameness in horses and an ideal reference for veterinary students wanting to learn the fundamentals of lameness.

### **Promoting and Tracking Your Research Using Google Scholar**

Scholarly metrics are a way of showing the impact of your publications. You can set up a Google Scholar Citations profile that will both allow you to track the citations to your work, and make sure that Google will correctly identify you and your work. By making your profile public, it will appear in the results of a Google Scholar author search. You can also use this account to link yourself to Mississippi State, ensure you're linked correctly to your articles, and manually add work not already in Google Scholar. You'll see citation metrics and can set up an alert when someone cites your work. Find out more here:
