Dear madam

Those lines have all well here & no bad  
cases at the lower place the sum complaint I sende to Croford depot on Thursday from  
the fact that I killd hogs on munday & could not get all fixt up that I wisht to sende  
before I sende you a barrel of back bones & ribs & sawing mite & a box of soap & one of  
sop & the shewe one bucket of butter I killd 21 hogs waining 42.96 lbs as we have  
not money to kill I thought hit best to wait & get the rest as good as I can what  
I have killd were good fat one of them waid 3.94 lbs of wood be glad if you can that  
you wood sende the barrel back when empty as I have made of more than I have got & hit will  
anen the same purpoe againe when I kill againe Delpha & Beckys child is improve  
in Delpha is spinning the just begun I have got the oxen we spoke of by the leve  
of Mr Gaston we find that the demand is so grate for shares that we were afraide to  
wait I have sold most corn anup to pay for them with 100 bushels that  
I let go atords them Jane says plese to excuse her for not spinning the thread  
better that the cards was so bad that she could not see hit may better  
Jane says there is one black ball & on purple one for M<sup>rs</sup> Foot & one black one  
for you I will extende to washing & drying the wheat as fast as I can but can du  
mity littel at hit now & I have a good deal to fix to pay for the ride of socle  
I was going to croffed with my self to day but then ar waggons  
hear after corn so that I cant leve in time I intended to see if the  
thing had cum to have ritthen & let you no but when I rite again I  
can let you no if they have cum the socs meet I spoke of  
sendin in a box will cum in a bucket you will plese tel  
Mag Walker I reser this letter & thank him for what things he  
can get & sende
