Letter, Dabney Martin to Elijah Hogan, March 20, 1836

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Decatur Ala. March 20th 1836

Mr Elizabth Hogan

Dear Sir

yours of the 29th Feb was recd a few days since and the contents
noted I discover you have not sold any of our lands
and you wished me to write if I had any other instructions
I have only one alteration to make as regards the sale of
our land as one year has rolled around and no sale yet
made not to sell on the same credit as proposed in my
Letter of the 17th July 1835 do not sell any of our lands
unless you can get one third paid in hand and the other
Two payments annul. say Section 24 18 & 19 T 19 R 16 at
Ten dollars that in Section 30 at seven that in 23 at eight
dollars and that in 20 & 19 T 19 R 15 at seven dollars at
the same payments. I have been anxious to sell as I
was a little straitened in my money matters but I
have got pretty well over that and do not feel so much
anxiety about the matter I had rather not sell at all
than to sell on any other terms than those proposed
above, say one third in hand and two annul payments for
the rest, as lands or rising and every other species
of property nothing more I only remain your
friend & C
