Decatur May 16th 1839

Dear Sir

I Recd your kinde favor of the 23 April and should
of replied ane deantley but I shoid it to Jm. Garthe
and also had recd a letter aboute the same time
from Mr Cannon relative to the land you spoke of
Garthe said that he was going down there in the
course of two or three weeks and would write to Mr
Cannon to that affect ane deantley, and that is the
Reason that I have not answered your letter before
But sum Buiscareps has prevented him from going
as early as he anticipated buto says he will go perhaps
in the course of three or four weeks as regards that
Land you spoke of we could not take very much
less than the price we set on it for them five quarters
is the very best land we holde in that purchase and
costs us much higher then the remaining parts
But I will not say what we will take as Garthe will
be there and I will leave it in the care with him but
we would like to selo at any thing like a fair price
