Scope and Contents

The Emmett Malvaney collection consists of seven sets of architectural drawings, which were once owned by Malvaney's father, Edgar, an architect in Jackson, Mississippi. Also included are the minutes (photocopied) of the Mississippi State Board of Architects, 1928-1929.

The drawings date from 1914-1928 and are attributed to H. N. Austin, Xavier Alexis Kramer, and Claude Henry Lindsley. The subjects are the Humphreys County Courthouse and Jail, the Walthall County Courthouse, the Boliver County Courthouse, the South Mississippi Charity Hospital in Laurel, the Capitol Ice Company building in Jackson, the Millsaps College Administration Building in Jackson, and the Home Economics and Hygiene Building on the campus of the Mississippi State College for Women in Columbus.

The drawings consist of 112 sheets, nearly all of which are linen. The largest sheet measures 41 1/8 inches by 30 1/8 inches; the smallest is 30 inches by 20 7/8 inches. Furniture details, colored sketches, and comments addressed to contractors are included on some drawings.
