My dear General,

You and your Military friends made me very happy. I hope it will not be the last interesting meeting I shall have with the same party.

I gave you a letter I addressed to President Lincoln dated April 1864. It being an addenda to a letter I addressed to the Sanitary Committee of Albany in February 1864 I think, in order to appreciate the addenda both letters ought to be published at the same time. The letter to the Sanitary Committee, although published, was not intended for publication. Hence the addenda, which to be appreciated requires
