Dear Queenie:

Your letter received, but I am so busy that I have no time to write, or to do anything else. I will tell you, however, how your matter stands.

You sent my \$ 1350.00, which I invested as follows, to wit; on the 1st. of November 1893, \$ 500.00, on November 20th. \$ 500.00, on 18th. of January 1894, I invested \$ 100.00, and the balance \$ 100.00, I invested on the 1st. day of February, 1894. Out of the amount sent me I paid express charges on the same \$2.00.

I have made a careful calculation, and there was due you on the 1st of January 1894, balance of interest up to that date only \$ 7.32, of course after paying the two dollars express charges, and deducting the interest on the amounts invested on the 18th. of January and 1st. of February. So you see that on the first day of January 1894, you have in my hands to your credit, bearing interest at eight per cent. from that date \$ 1360.00. The annual interest will be \$ 100.00 or \$ 9.00 per month. I send you herewith, ten dollars (\$ 10.00), which pays the interest up to the first of January, and \$ 2.00 on the January interest. Your little taxes I have not yet charged to you. You will see that I still owe you \$ 6.32 on the January interest.

Please acknowledge receipt of this letter and preserve it as my obligation to you for the money is my hands. Write me the amount you are obliged to have, and I will pay it. *Your Mother M. S.*
