Dear Sir,

Assured you will please find

Account Sales of 30 Bales Cotton received of St. Pauls which I trust you  
may find correct. I am in possession of your esteemed fav. 2<sup>d</sup> that states that  
you had shipped 40 Bales, as you will perceive I have only received 30. Hope  
soon to have the balance. By all means endeavor to hurry all the Cotton you  
can down here, as the earlier it is in this Market the better the price, if this  
30 Bales had been here a month sooner it would have brought at least 10 more.

By the first direct conveyance to Gayou City, I will send the  
articles you order. I trust by this time that you may have at least 5000  
Cotton wool, but at any rate what ever you have send down at once.

You will please accept my best thanks for the favor of  
your little Boys they are very fine. The net proceeds of your sales I have  
forwarded to the Credit of your Note, - I remain Sir,
