Dear Mims :

I am in receipt of your letter of Thursday-
I would like to write you fully about that awful and deplorable
accident, but am too badly grieved and depressed to attempt it now.
You could hardly imagine any thing so terrible and so sad.
Our whole neighborhood seems to be wrapped in a pall of gloom.
I am truly sorry to hear of Nettie's continued indisposition -
I called on her at the Sanatorium a week or so since, thought
she was looking real well, and was real cheerful.
I truly hope that the treatment will prove beneficial, and that
you will soon be back home, well rewarded for the trip.
Now, Mims, if there is any thing that I can be of some help to
you be sure to call on me. I believe this leaves us all very
well- Sister and Cora are with Cal's wife, Laura-Bonner is here
with his mother- Ruth is at Hattiesburg taking a Normal course.
Mims left with the Marines for France one day last week. All of
my children are here with me- Lucile and Genie having gotten back
from school about 10 days ago. If it were possible we would be
glad to have you and Nettie come to see us.
