Shipped by White Head in good order and
 well conditioned on board sundry flat bottom boats
 whose of is master Elijah Hagan ^{Ja. Hagan} & now lying
 at Ditto's Landing on the Tennessee river and have
 and face New Orleans, to say one hundred and
 Eighty two bales of cotton weighing fifty
 four thousand nine hundred & twenty nine
 pounds being marked and numbered as in
 the margin, also one hoghead of Tobacco supposed
 to weigh fifteen hundred pounds. Num-
 bered one & marked as in the margin also
 one bale of deer skins weighing two hundred
 and eighty five pounds & box containing
 two hundred & forty six small furs, each Num-
 bered one and marked as in the margin, and
 are to be delivered in like good order & well conditioned
 at the aforesaid port of New Orleans (the dangers of
 the river only excepted) unto Benjamin Stony or his
 assigns he or they paying freight for the said Cotton
 Tobacco & skins at the rate of one cent per pound.
 In witness whereof the masters of said boats hath
 affirmed to three bills of lading all of this tenor
 and date the one of which being accomplished
 the others to stand void. dated at Ditto's Landin-
 g the 26th March 1817.

Received also one bale of small furs, weighing one
 hundred & twenty pounds & containing two
