as mentioned below which I promise to deli-
ver to Benjamin Story in New Orleans
in like good order and condition with all
possible dispatch the dangers of the river ex-
cepted he or they paying freight for the
same at the rate of one Dollar per hun-
dred pounds Signed three bills of lading
of this tenor and date
Marked C & W Elijah Hogan
