Shipped in good order & well conditioned by
Tudor & McCallister in & upon sundry flat boats, com-
manded by Nealley & Hogan now lying at Ditto's Landing
on Tennessee River & bound for New Orleans. viz
as in the margin severally being marked & numbered
as in the margin & weighing together twenty six
thousand & four hundred & seventeen pounds which are to be de-
livered at New Orleans in like good order & condition
the danger of the river & unavoidable accident excepted
unto Benjamin Story or to his assigns here or they
paying me freight for the same at the rate of one cent
per pound. In witness whereof the Commander
of said boats has affirmed to four bills of lading
one of which being accomplished the other to stand
void - Dated at Ditto's Landing. Madison County
Mississippi Territory - March 5th
