My dear Sir.

Will it not be necessary to have the minutes of Presbytery with me, at Synod? I will start in company with B. Vancom, about the 1st Oct^r. — Be so good, accordingly, to send the volume or volumes containing the whole proceedings, so that I may have time to look them over and make myself familiar with them.

I hope you are in the enjoyment of good health. — We are pretty well here, with the exception of myself: my liver is considerably affected. We had a case of malignant fever the other day, which excited a good deal of alarm for a time: but the alarm has subsided. —
