MOORHEAD, Miss. March 9--

The Democrats of Moorhead gathered in a mass meeting Monday night to study the so-called Civil Rights Laws proposed by President Truman for enactment by Congress.

The voters protested the passage of laws taking from the state or the local government their Civil Rights under the constitution of the United States.

More than one hundred male voters in this small precinct pledged a finish fight on any attempt by any leader, or any party or any combination of parties to destroy, submerge or take away their Civil Rights under the constitution to conduct their own state and local government.

A considerable sum of money was raised to support the activities of Governor Fielding L. Wright's Southern party.
