Kind Sir:—

I have finished the
press. I packed over the very
best of it. If there be no
mistake in my count, I have
got you over three
hundred (300) boxes. I
could not hire any labor and
that fact caused me to take
the wagon out to get and
haul all the hay up to
the press. I could

my move
that grass. It took me
four (4) days and a half (1/2)
to haul it and store it
away in that place. We
were waiting on the
camp for the well. I am
waiting for my check now.
Please, Sir, for the grass.
Your promise was 72¢ per
bale to me. I would greatly
thank you for the check.
