December 2nd. 1913.

Dear Mama:-

Upon my return here from Mobile where I want to buy a few goods for my new store, I find your letter asking that I be with you on last Sunday. I am very busy now as you know and I do think that I shall be busy always. Even when I was out of the Store business I was kept busy all the time at something.

I go to Ferry once in awhile and have to at end to my business there and get out as quickly as possible.

I hope the boys feel better from their trip home and that they are making good progress at school.

I know that it takes hard study and hard work to attain any success at school. Most people do not want their children undergo the hard study and work that is necessary to obtain the required success and make the progress they should and that is the reason that so few make their mark at College.
