Dear Cammie:-

I have been wanting to write you for some time but I have been so busy trying to get started in business.

I know that I have worked harder at this job of getting open and started off than I ever did in my life.

I wish to have a talk with you when you will designate the time and place, about the matters you referred to in your letter and I want to assure you that I do not think your health in any dangerous condition but inasmuch as you wish to have some understanding about your affairs I shall be the gladdest in the world to know your wishes in the matter and render you all the aid and assistance that I possibly can or could.

I have wanted to write you and send you some more money on the account of Mims' school expenses. I want you to run an account against him covering every item of expenditure made in his behalf in schooling and I shall pay it along as I am able to do so. I have been at the greatest expense of my life to get a building up and started off. You know all new stock for opening store is supposed to be cash and I had to build a brick store or none at all and it has put me to the hardest that I ever been up against in my life.
