Plantation hereby agrees to take due care of said cotton whilst on his plantation, and to deliver the same at his own expense, at Vaiden in the State of Mississippi to the order of the Secretary of the Treasury, or his Agents, or their Assigns.

The undersigned, as Agent of the Government, certifies that the within Cotton has been examined by him or by a competent judge, and that its character will rank according to the commercial scale as

middling and also, that the weights and marks are as described—the Cotton being in good merchantable order, and safely stored in a covered building.

The undersigned certifies that the price agreed upon is a fair market price at the present time.
