Bunnery to Leonard Davis's Negro Sam for
Thirty seven Dollars & seventy five cents dated
in 1812 & payable 1st January 1813 for
Thomas G. Perry. said to be for Corn for
the use of Woodlawn Plantation -

at the foot of the Note was written thus,
"The above note was given for thirty seven
Dollars & seventy five cents".

The Note was torn by accident and this
is all that is found of it -

9th March 1819 - Elijah Smith

Noting 21st March 1820 Received of Elijah
fifty four Dollars being the amount of
Note above named and the Interest thereon
for Corn sold for the use of the Estate of
John Ellis at Woodlawn in 1812 -
Witness ^{his} Negro Sam
