CYCLONE. Was sired by Black Squirrel, he by Wilson's Premium saddle and harness horse, John Morgan, of Kentucky origin, pedigree unknown. Cyclone's dam was Minnie Harper, the most perfect and noted saddle mare Tennessee ever produced, and sold for more money than any unknown blood of her time, Black Squirrel's dam was Conatson's premium saddle mare, and John Morgan's dam was Taylor's noted Kentucky saddle mare.
