Gentlemen:

Complying with your request and in accordance with my telegram of this date, I send you herewith, No. 5554, State of Alabama, issued May 1st, 1904, twenty dollars, which you will please return to me when it shall have served your purpose, or if I shall have use for it before you return it I will write or wire you.

While the Grand Jury here has failed to indict us up to date, and have passed adversely on the proposition of the attorneys of the United States to indict, the special agent is doing all he can to have them withdraw their action, and to bring still further evidence before the jury. We have no apprehension with the matter in the hands of an intelligent prosecution jury, but if, peradventure, we should at any time be indicted, I shall want to use this warrant of the same as evidence. There is not a respectable lawyer here who does not regard the prosecution as outrageous and absurd, and not the slightest apprehension is felt on account of the proceeding.
