Dear Sir

When I came here to nurse four years ago, one student was employed at the hospital as clerk for the Surgeon, and a negro boy to assist the nurse; For the past three years I have been doing all of the work heretofore done by the clerk, as well as dispensing with the services of a negro boy most of the time, I am employed only nine months of the year at a salary of thirty Dollars a month, and what I save in that time, is spent in my support for the summer.

In consideration of the above, I respectfully ask that my salary be raised to forty Dollars per month, commencing with the next session.

Hoping that this request may meet with your approval.
