I received your letter

some time ago but it got misplaced in my desk and I regret to say that it has been overlooked till this afternoon. Judge Williams was under my care at the time of his death. It is often impossible in a given case to say definitely which was the primary and which was the secondary lesion for these

Cases usually do not consult the physician till both are present. In the Judger case we believe that the liver trouble really had more to do with the fatal result probably than the associated heart and kidney changes - as a matter of fact however the three conditions are so intimately associated with each other that some teach that they are all simply a part of the same process.
