

No. 87. U. S. S. "MISSOURI." Battleship of the first class. Launched at Newport News, Virginia, December 28, 1901; length 393 feet 11 inches; breadth 72 feet 2½ inches; draught 23 feet 11 inches; displacement 13,500 tons; speed 18.15 knots; 40 guns and 2 torpedo tubes; 40 officers and 739 men.
