I acknowledge receipt of your recent wire concerning House bills, #792, #793 and #794.

H. R. 792 was a FEPC bill and therefore when House bill 4453 passed the House of Representatives this disposed of #792. As you have doubtless read in the papers the FEPC bill that was passed merely set up a commission but did not have incorporated in it any of the features of the original FEPC bill. The FEPC bill will probably be before the Senate at an early date and of course I shall continue to fight for its defeat in the Senate.

H. R. 793 is now in the House Committee on Education and Labor and H. R. 794 is in the House Committee on Agriculture. I have checked with both of these committees and was told that no action has been taken nor is there any reason to expect early action on these bills.
