My Dear Sir:-

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your kind letter of yesterday approving the views set forth in my letter to Hon. John A. Redwood on the currency question, and to thank you for the same. I conscientiously believe it is on the right line, and that the principles therein enunciated will ultimately prevail. No matter to what political party a man may owe his allegiance, he should use his best efforts for the maintenance of the integrity and honor of his government. Without financial standing among the commercial nations of the world, our future would be anything but hopeful.

I hope never to see silver monometalism in the United States, but the 10 to 1, unlimited, must inevitably lead to that result. Let us have silver and gold of equal value; that will be honest bimetallism and anything else is a delusion.
