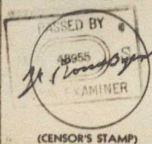

Germany

Well, I finally made it, although they kept us in France so long that I was beginning to think we were in the French Army. Right now I'm in on the softest deal Sis had since Sis been in the Army. I'm working in the map depot back at 22nd Corps Head quarters and I do is count and issue maps to attached units. We're set up in an aluminum plant, no there's heat, lights, and hot showers. Even have movies three nights a week. Tough life, isn't it? Received your V-mail of March 9<sup>th</sup> a couple of weeks ago. Don't believe Sis written since then, have I? She wrote all about the wedding. Sunday has a lovely affair at my house, some
