are delicious, Julia. Thanks ever so
much. The letters have really been
stacking up the last couple of days
since mail finally started coming in.
Six V-mails from you - March 20, 29, 30,
and April 3, 5. Enjoyed your letters from
West Point so much. It's nice to get a
first hand report on the family, and
know that everyone is really fine. How
I've enjoyed her little visits with you.
My answer is "no" to all 3 of your questions
in your Apr. 5th letter. Hope you know where
I was by now. Thanks again, with all my love,
Son
