Dear Sir-

I have a boy ,16 years of age, whom I have planned to give a classical education. My duties however, as an officer of the Marine-Hospital Service, keep me moving quite frequently from one station to another, and this has somewhat broken in upon his education.

Since coming to Ship Island—one year ago—the boy has had some home teaching in arithmetic, algebra, latin, french and german, and he has had an opportunity to develop physically by his outdoor life.

I write to ask your advice in regard to his future education. He has no settled plan as to his future career, and I thought it well to give him as good general equipment as possible and let him choose, as opportunities present.

I have heard your college highly praised and if you will send me some information as to its fulfilling the above requirements, and the expenses attached I shall be under many obligations to you.

It is my intention to send him to school after the coming holidays, and I would like to know what qualifications are necessary for admission to your college.
