December 17, 1895.

My dear Jennie:-

Without waiting to hear from you I have concluded to send you the money to pay your way home for Christmas, and inclose herewith, ten dollars. Not that I want you to spend so much as that on the trip, but to spend as little as you can, to be comfortable and to have the usual conveniences. You had better get your ticket through via Winona to Jackson, and not ask for any half rate ticket. It will cost no more and you will have the hack from depot at Winona to the hotel, and your trunk, if you have it, will be checked through to Jackson. So you will buy your ticket straight through to Jackson, and tell the other girls that it will be best for them to do so too.

I write a note to Dr. Frazer to day requesting to give you leave of absence so that you can come Friday, provided you wish to get off then.

If I am not too much engaged I may meet you at Winona. If I do not I wish you to go to the same hotel, get breakfast there and be ready for the first South bound train. All well. Love to the girls.
