The man who drove the
car shurely did go fast.
I was praying all the
way.

They are building a
bridge over the "Big
Black" (a river) and
we had to Detour.

It was evidently the
dump place of Durant
for tin can bodies
of old rusted cars,
were all along the way.
We just passed.

through Jacksona
few minutes ago.
We saw a 10 story
hotel and an ele-
vator going up in it.

Fannie
Sanders
aged 11 yrs -
