Your valued favor of 9<sup>th</sup> inst came duly to hand and we have enclosed a statement of your account made up to date, all the drafts mentioned have been presented and paid with the exception of \$19<sup>62</sup> favor D & Phans which will be paid as presented, and have included the amount in the account. The balance in your favor amounts to 1153<sup>72</sup> which we have this day authorized Messrs Fleming & Waldwin to draft on us at sight for, and trust you will find all correct and satisfactory on examination.

Cotton market rather quiet to day Prices however remain very full.
