Dear Unnest-

I inclose Check for \$56.00, Thirty dollars for you and Twenty five dollars for your mother. Collect the check from Mr. Bourdan, whom I have written requesting him to pay it, and pay your mother \$ 25.00, and you keep the thirty dollars. Write me when you get the money, that I may know it is all right.

I send a copy of a letter I received from the Railroad authorities which explains itself. If I hear from them again I will write to your Aunt Ned or Sally, and let them know the terms. I have never known just how they were fixed for going; whether they had received the money or not, and if so, how much. It will be a rather expensive trip if full fare has to be paid both ways, for all that crowd.

We have nothing new here. We had a big rain yesterday, but it is not again today, and we may have more rain to-night.

Bill says I received her letter, and will write her when I get a little leisure; I am very busy, and very hard at work. Mr. Cavett, my business partner is absent, leaving me all the work of the office, which been quite heavy.
