Dear Miss Daisy:-

On my return from Memphis after several days absence I found your letter of the 14th, instant, and hasten to comply with your request as best I can. I am quite indisposed, and had to make my letter short and to the point.

I saw Prof. Kincannon before I left home, and only the day after Mrs. Peyton's death, and asked him about filling the vacancy. He said it ought to be filled, but from other remarks, not very clear, I was left in doubt whether it would be filled immediately or not. I suppose the limited means and the lateness of the session may possibly have led the Executive Committee and the President to a postponement of the selection of a successor to Mrs. Peyton, for the present. This is merely a surmise of my own, for I know nothing whatever about it.
