My dear Sir & Brother:-

My decision that the Corner Stone of a building must be laid in the North East Corner thereof, is sustained by the Chairman of the Committee on Law and Jurisprudence, who informs me that this was held by a former Grand Master, and therefore, with my conviction in the premises, sustained by this high authority, I cannot consent to the laying of the Corner Stone of the Masonic Building at Durant, by the authority of the Grand Lodge, unless it be laid in the North East Corner.
