

Most Worshipful Brother:-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 9th. instant, inclosing circular from Carrollton Lodge No. 36, soliciting contributions to aid said Lodge in building a new Hall. While this is doubtless an innocent inadvertance on the part of the brother who forwarded the circular to any point outside of this Jurisdiction, it is in direct violation of Section 33, of our Rules and Regulations which forbid any subordinate Lodge or individual Mason within this jurisdiction applying to the fraternity of other jurisdictions for any contribution for any purpose, whatever, without first obtaining the approval of the Grand Lodge or Grand Master.

The attention to Carrollton Lodge shall be called to the matter, and we hope it will not occur again.
