STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened, That our Senators in Congress be instructed and our Representatives requested to use their efforts to procure the passage of an act of Congress for the removal from Exeter to Concord of the terms of the circuit court and district court of the United States for the district of New Hampshire, which are now required by law to be held at Exeter.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be instructed to communicate the foregoing resolution to each of our said Senators and Representatives in Congress.
